Bernardo Hernandez, Director of the Department of Community Planning, gave a staff report.

The presiding officer called for public testimony.

Brad King, resident of the Borough and owner of Lot 2A1 within the proposed rezone area, spoke in opposition of the rezone request and gave a history of the property. Mr. King supported the Planning Commission's Findings of Fact and felt this was a neighborhood dispute.

Arron Welterlen, resident of the Borough and owner of Lot 2A3 and the rental cabins within the proposed rezone area, stated his rental units are nice, built by code and offer affordable units for college students or married couples.

Warren Frank, resident of the Borough and renter within the proposed rezone area spoke in support of the rezone request. He stated he has two daughters and expressed his concern of increased traffic with the addition of 16 more rental cabins as proposed by the property owners of 2A1 and 2A3.

Elizabeth Bear, resident of the Borough, testified as a concerned person. She felt "outhouses" are regressive and hurt resale values of the existing houses in the area.

Tanya Bear, resident of the Borough and renter in the rezone area, spoke in support of the rezone request. She commented on the poor visibility entering the neighborhood and her concerns with the addition of outhouses in the area.

Chad Bear, resident of the Borough and property owner in the proposed rezone area, stated that 7 of the 9 property owners in the area reside in the neighborhood and opposed the addition of rental cabins.

CITIZEN'S COMMENTS – continued

Nathan Smoot, resident of the Borough, stated he lives in North Pole and lives in a GU1 area and would be upset if this type of rezone request were to happen within his neighborhood. He spoke in opposition of the ordinance.

Mark Sherman, resident of the Borough, testified that he was a civil engineer with no vested interest in this area. He commented on the “grey water” generated from these types of proposed rentals and the health hazards that could be caused in the future.

Ted Ewe, resident of the Borough and new owner of a home in the proposed in the rezone area, commented that overnight dry cabins began to appear in the area and the contractors were building all day and all night to gain grandfather rights. He further commented that the laws allow 51% of the property owners to rezone their property.

Mike Prax, resident of the Borough, spoke in opposition of the rezone request. He stated the area was zoned as GU1 and property was purchased in the area because of that zone and the development of rental housing.

Maria Mandich, resident of the Borough and applicant of rezone stated the property owners who opposed this rezone did not live in the area and have no intention of living in the area. Ms. Mandich requested support of the ordinance for the property residents.

Lance Roberts, resident of the Borough, spoke in opposition of the rezone request. He stated the owners purchased the property because it was GU1 and it should remain as such.

Dan Abts, resident of the Borough, spoke in support of the rezone. He stated he owned high quality rental cabins in the area but felt the proposed dry cabins would bring down the property values in the area.

Guy Mandich, resident of the Borough and property owner within the subdivision, stated that all those who actually lived in the area supported the rezone. Only those who did not live within the area were opposed. He asked the Assembly to support the rezone request.

Delisha Heart, resident of the Borough, spoke for her father who could not be present at the meeting. She stated she supported the rezone request.

The presiding officer called for testimony, there being none public hearing was closed.
