Shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough use up to \$15 million from a \$15 million state grant already received, solely for this purpose, for the design and construction of a Multi-Purpose Community Activity Center located on a site adjacent to Alaskaland Park, bounded by Second Avenue, Wilbur Street, Hilton Avenue, and Moore Street? The primary purpose of the Community Activity Center would be for conventions, major spectator events, and home and trade shows, and for community use including meetings, exhibits, banquets and concerts. Estimated net annual maintenance and operation cost for the first two years is \$250,000 per year. After the second year of operation, annual revenues generated by Community Activity Center are estimated to equal or exceed annual maintenance and operations costs. The total construction cost, including site acquisition, is expected to be \$15 million.”

Proposition B

Shall the following proposed by initiative pursuant to AS 29.26.170 of the Alaska State Statutes, be enacted:

"An Ordinance to limit the amount of Borough Tax That Can Be Levied."

BE IT ENACTED: Section 3.08.140 is hereby amended by adding a new section 3.08.145, as follows:

3.08.45. Total amount of borough tax that can be levied.

- A. Except as provided in this section, the total amount of municipal tax that can be levied during a fiscal year shall not exceed the total amount approved by the Borough Assembly for the preceding year by more than a percentage determined by adding the percentage increase in the Federal Consumer Price Index for Anchorage from the preceding fiscal year.
- B. The limitations set forth in subsection (A) do not apply to the following
 - 1. Taxes on new construction or property improvements which occur during the current fiscal year.
 - 2. Any appropriation made to pay or secure payment of principle and/or interest on bonds.
 - 3. Taxes required to fund additional services authorized by voter approved ballot issues.
 - 4. Funding of new judgments entered against the Fairbanks North Star Borough.
 - 5. Special appropriations necessary on an emergency basis to fund unavoidable expenses insuring the public peace, health or safety.
- C. Any tax increase which results from the exceptions set forth in subsection B. 1-3 above, is actually expanded, shall be added to the base amount which is used in subsection A for calculation of the subsequent year's tax increase.

The projects listed below may be accomplished in addition to, or in lieu of, the elementary school construction and districtwide upgrade and repair projects approved by Ordinance No. 85-107, or they may not be accomplished at all, as funds available from all sources permit. Bond funds may not be obligated for payment of all or any part of the cost of projects C-F until the Borough Assembly determines that sufficient funds from all sources are available to pay the entire cost of both projects A and B. After this determination, projects C-F may be undertaken in the order in which they may appear.

***A "Yes" vote means the tax cap will remain in effect and for two years the Borough may not negate or modify the effect of the tax cap. – 9970**

A "No" vote means the tax cap will remain in effect but beginning in October, 1991, the Borough has the power to repeal or change the tax cap in any way. - 6074
