The borough mayor shall be elected for a term of three (3) years, shall serve until a successor is elected and qualified, and is to begin service on the first Monday following certification of the mayor's election.

NO PERSON WHO HAS BEEN ELECTED AS BOROUGH MAYOR FOR TWO (2) FULL SUCCESSIVE TERMS SHALL BE AGAIN ELIGIBLE TO HOLD THAT OFFICE UNTIL ONE (1) FULL YEAR HAS INTERVENED.

2.04.020 Term Election

The term of an assemblyperson is three (3) years or until a successor is elected and qualified. **NO PERSON WHO HAS BEEN ELECTED AS ASSEMBLYPERSON FOR TWO (2) FULL SECESSIVE TERMS SHALL BE AGAIN ELIGIBLE TO HOLD THAT OFFICE UNTIL ONE (1) FULL YEAR HAS INTERVENED.** An assemblyperson is elected at large by all qualified voters of the borough to the seat for which he as declared his candidacy. No person may be a candidate for more than one (1) assembly seat at any election.

Proposition No. 1

Ordinance Establishing Maximum Allowable Tax Revenues

Shall Sections 3.08.141 and 3.08.142 of the Fairbanks North Star Borough Code of Ordinances be enacted as follows? These Sections will provide for limitations on the maximum allowable tax revenues for the Fairbanks North Star Borough. Under Section 3.08.141 the Borough will be able to levy or impose only the same amount of taxes for one fiscal year as the borough levied or imposed for the preceding year, except that the borough can increase the amount of taxes levied or imposed (a) to adjust for inflation; (b) to take into account new buildings and land coming onto the tax rolls; (c) make new payments on bonds; (d) pay for services approved by voters; (e) pay for new legal judgments entered against the borough; and (f) pay for expenses in emergencies. Section 3.08.142 provides a formula and definitions for the limitations of Section 3.08.141.

PORT AUTHORITY

Shall Ordinance No. 99-059 be approved providing for the creation of a Port Authority to be known as the Alaska Gasline Port Authority?

Summary of Ordinance No. 99-059. This Ordinance, if approved by the voters of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, will create, pursuant to state law, the Alaska Gasline Port Authority. The purpose of the Port Authority is to build or cause to be built, with other municipalities which may include the City of Valdez, The North Slope Borough, and the Municipality of Anchorage, a natural gas pipeline Project from facilities in the Prudhoe Bay area in the North Slope Borough through The Fairbanks North Star Borough to Valdez, and to share the net revenues from the Project. The debts, liabilities and obligations of the Alaska Gasline Port Authority shall not constitute debts, liabilities or obligations of the Fairbanks North Star Borough.

The term "Projects" shall mean the acquisition, construction, financing, installation and improvements of a port facility in the Port of Valdez, including associated and related facilities for the conditioning, transportation, liquefaction, storage and shipping of natural gas and other commodities to, at and from such a facility. The Project shall also include conditioning plants, compressor stations, pipelines, spur lines and liquefied natural gas facilities and shall also include the acquisition and purchase of natural gas.

Under Section 3.08.141 the borough will be able to levy or impose only the same amount of taxes for one fiscal year as the borough levied or imposed for the preceding year, except that the borough can increase the amount of taxes levied or imposed (a) to adjust for inflation; (b) to take into account new buildings and land coming onto the tax rolls; (c) make new payments on bonds; (d) pay for services approved by voters; (e) pay for new legal judgments entered against the borough; and (f) pay for expenses in emergencies. Section 3.08.142 provides a formula and definitions for the limitations of Section 3.08.141.
