Attached for your approval is a proposed ordinance, amending the FY 2021-22 budget by appropriating \$10,367,822 in U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) 2021 Targeted Air Shed Grant (TAS) funding to the Transit Enterprise Projects Fund voluntary Removal, Replacement, Repair, and Bounty Program and the voluntary No Other Adequate Source of Heat (NOASH) Reduction Program (collectively referred to as the Wood Stove Change-Out Programs)

As you are well aware, the Fairbanks North Star Borough (Borough) is dealing with a serious PM_{2.5} air pollution issue. Control measures are necessary to reduce PM2.5 pollution. The most effective control measures incorporate quantifiable reductions of direct PM_{2.5} emissions along with broad public support, and the Wood Stove Change-Out Programs incorporate both of those attributes. By approving the proposed ordinance, you are enabling the Borough to take another step towards solving the PM_{2.5} air pollution issue.
